Sunday 10th December 2023

Advent is a period of four weeks and five Sundays preceding Christmas as we consider how a Saviour is God's gift to humanity.

Last week, in our first week of Advent, we considered the quality of hope. In our Christian worldview, hope is not something whimsical or contingent, as if to say; 'I hope the weather tomorrow will be fine.' Instead, Christian hope is certain and assured, based on two unchangeable and rock-solid certainties: the fulfilled promise of God to send the Messiah and the proven resurrection of Jesus by which he demonstrated His authority and capacity to do what he promises.

Our second week of Advent is themed 'Peace'. In a world of trouble, where our repeated prayers for peace seem to be rarely or only partially answered, we could be discouraged that our God is impotent to stop the hand of violence. However, there is another way to see the world which is more fully in accord with Chistian teaching and experience: the world continues to be violent because God restrains Himself from imposing His will during this age. And, furthermore, the main end and goal of peace is not the mere absence of violence in this passing age, but eternal Peace between a just God and diminished humanity. In other words, God both gives us opportunity to live up to our responsibilities in the here and now by working for physical peace, and has established a path of eternal peace for those who will trust on Jesus.

The real Peace we are offered is peace between God and person: For God was pleased to have all his fullness dwell in Jesus, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making peace through his blood, shed on the cross. (Colossians 1:18-20)

Song for the Season

As we enter Advent and prepare ourselves for Christmas, our new song of the season reminds us that Jesus coming to earth is good news for all people. The song, *Go Tell it on the Mountain*, is an African-American spiritual based on Luke's record of Jesus' birth being announced to the shepherds. It draws on an image from the prophet Isaiah, who says, 'How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of the messenger who brings good news, the good news of peace and salvation, the news that the God of Israel reigns! (Isa 52:7 NLT). And it evokes the Great Commission of Matthew 28:18-20, in which Jesus authorizes his followers to go and teach his ways to all the world and gather people into God's family.

Jesus is God's good news to us! This season we celebrate together who he is and what he means for us all. Our song of the season inspires us to share with joy the good news about Jesus to everywhere to everyone.

Mark 1:1-11 (New living Translation)

This is the Good News about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God. It began 2 just as the prophet Isaiah had written: "Look, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, and he will prepare your way. 3 He is a voice shouting in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord's coming! Clear the road for him!"

4 This messenger was John the Baptist. He was in the wilderness and preached that people should be baptized to show that they had repented of their sins and turned to God to be forgiven. 5 All of Judea, including all the people of Jerusalem, went out to see and hear John. And when they confessed their sins, he baptized them in the Jordan River. 6 His clothes were woven from coarse camel hair, and he wore a leather belt around his waist. For food he ate locusts and wild honey.

7 John announced: "Someone is coming soon who is greater than I am—so much greater that I'm not even worthy to stoop down like a slave and untie the straps of his sandals. 8 I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit!" 9 One day Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee, and John baptized him in the Jordan River. 10 As Jesus came up out of the water, he saw the heavens splitting apart and the Holy Spirit descending on him like a dove. 11 And a voice from heaven said, "You are my dearly loved Son, and you bring me great joy."

2 Peter 3:8-15 (New International Version - UK)

8 But do not forget this one thing, dear friends: with the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day . 9 The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.

10 But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare.

11 Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives 12 as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming. That day will bring about the destruction of the heavens by fire, and the elements will melt in the heat. 13 But in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, where righteousness dwells.

14 So then, dear friends, since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at peace with him. 15 Bear in mind that our Lord's patience means salvation, just as our dear brother Paul has written to you with the wisdom given to him by God.
